INSTRUCTOR'S UPDATE - Weil's Disease Information

Following reports about the increase in cases of Leptospira bacteria being present in inland waters all over the UK, we are issuing the following announcement to all members. Leptospira bacteria is found in contaminated water, which can lead to Weil's disease. Weil's disease causes flu-like symptoms with a long incubation period, so symptoms may not begin to appear until several weeks following contact.

We would like to reassure you all that we have **not** had any cases at the club, nor do we have any reason to believe the water its contaminated. Weil's disease is extremely rare in the UK, and can be treated by antibiotics, however we would like to remind all members to:

- Wash and disinfect hands thoroughly following water activities at the club this includes handling any equipment that touches the water or boats
- In the case of immersion (e.g. following a capsize), shower and wash clothes as soon as possible.
- Cover any open cuts and grazes with a waterproof plaster before going out on the water, and clean any new injuries as soon as possible.
- If you develop flu-like symptoms following any on-water activity, contact your GP and inform them of where you have been sailing.

Once again, we would like to re-iterate that we have **not** had any cases at the club.
