After finishing my sailing stages and in order to give something back to the club I moved into instructing becoming an AI in 2016 before moving on to Dinghy In-


structor and earlier this year completing both my Senior Dinghy Instructor and Powerboat Instructor tickets. I hope to use these at WWYSA for many years to come.

#### Wildlife on the Lake

There is a variety of wildlife on Edenvale Lake, including

#### Muscovey Duck

We have one solitary Muscovey Duck on the lake. He mixes in quite well with the other birds on the lake. His features seem more pronounced than the average Muscovey but seems quite happy. Seen eating the weed and the food from the people that come down and feed the wildlife from time to time.

#### Radio Controlled Boats

Since the last newsletter the weather has mostly been sunny and bright but has not always played fair to us sailors.

Light to non- existent winds have curtailed racing on several days, and the odd localised shower has dampened enthusiasm a little. But on the whole we have enjoyed good sailing with competitive racing and a good number of boats and winners. As an example on one day seven races were contested by nine boats, with five of these races won by five different helms and the remaining positions being closely fought over.

We are currently holding the Summer series of races on Thursdays and the Annual series which runs throughout the whole year on Saturdays. The idea being that if you can only sail at the weekend, or alternatively midweek, it is possible to concentrate on one series. The more results you can obtain per series the better overall it will be. For each race, points are awarded to the same value as your finishing position, 1 for first place, 2 for second, 3 for third etc. Using the same number of races for each sailor every ones best races are totted up and the worst races discarded, during these calculations an overall series results table emerges. The sailor with the least points wins.

But aside from the sailing, isn't it nice just to be out and about at the lakeside, enjoying the company of other people, the banter, fresh air and wildlife, time away from gardening and chores. Long may it continue.
