The Canada Goose

The Canada goose is a large wild goose with a black head and neck, white cheeks, white under its chin, and a brown body. It is native to the arctic and temperate regions of North America, and its migration occasionally reaches across the Atlantic to northern Europe. Canada Geese migrate south in winter and north in summer, but their travels may take a few detours along the way. Individuals may move several to hundreds of miles during the late spring and summer to large bodies of water where they will be safer as they moult their wing feathers.

Radio Sailing—August Update

As we move into Autumn it's hard to believe how fast this year seems to be disappearing. Our Summer series of races on Thursdays are now concluded and the results are in! The Annual series raced on Saturdays continues until the end of the year, and the Autumn series will start on Thursday 2nd of September.

Now for the Summer series details, we sailed 80 races over 13 weeks and the total number of entries during the series was 436. The results are calculated using individual sailors best 35 finishing positions, unfortunately this will exclude some helms who did not reach the 35 race threshold.

Points are awarded in line with finishing positions, 1 point for 1st, 2 points for 2nd, 3 points for 3rd etc.


