Introducing Woman Who Sail... Apart from at Westbury....

Sailing used to be a "man's world". **Grace O'Mally** born in Ireland around 1530 changed this. She disguised herself as a boy to board a ship so that she could join her father on his journey to Spain. After her father died Grace became a famous woman sailor/pirate, and great sailor. History refers to her as the world's greatest female pirate.

Skipper Thuridur born 1777 was the world's earliest female sailor. She was only 11 when she joined her father's fishing crew to become a sailor.

In Modern Times

Krystyna Chojnowska Liskiewicz born 1936. She was the first woman to sail single handed around the world in 1976 narrowly beating Naomi James.

Dame Naomi James born 1949. In 1977 she was the first woman sailor to sail solo around the globe via the great clipper route.

Kay Cottee finished a solo circumnavigation of the globe in 189 days without stopping and without assistance, she was even washed overboard when her boat capsized in a large wave. She lived to tell the tale.

Laura Dekker born 1995. She was 13 years old when she circumnavigated the world single handed. She is the youngest girl/woman to do so.

Ellen MacArthur (La Petite Anglaise as the French call her) born 1976. She broke the world record for the fastest solo circumnavigation of the globe, she did the trip in 71 days and 14 hours.

Galia Moss Born in Mexico was the first Latin American woman to sail across the Atlantic Ocean alone in 2006. She did it in 41 days.

The Latest Achievements Today

Tracey Edwards MBE born 1962. She was the skipper of the first all girl crew to enter the Whitbread Round the World Race in 1989, and won!!

Susie Goodall Born 1989. She started racing Laser Dinghies. Susie took part in the vintage Golden Globe Race. Sailing non stop around the world in an old classic boat. She was in fourth position, unfortunately her Rustler 34 pitchpoled and capsized in 30-35 knots of wind, she was knocked out and the boat broke its rigging and mast. In the end she had to be rescued.

Sam Davies Born 1974 in Portsmouth. She sailed the Vendee Globe in 2008/2009 and finished fourth and in the 2020/2021 race her boat suffered keel damage. Only 71 sailors have finished this race out of 138. Her husband was also in the last race in his own boat.

Pip Hare born 1974 from East Anglia. She started sailing at 16. Pip completed the Vendee Globe Race in 2020/2021. and is working towards the next one in 2024. She won the Yachtswoman of the Year Award 2021.

Hannah Mills MBE Born 1988 in Cardiff. She started sailing at 8 years old in a mirror dinghy. She has become the 2 times World Champion in the Woman's 420 and 470 Class dinghies winning in 2012 and 2019. Hannah and Saskia Clark won a silver medal at the 2012 Olympics. Hannah and Eilidh McIntyre won a gold medal in the Women's 470 at the Tokyo Olympics. She has recently been awarded The World Sailor of the Year.

Radio Controlled Boat News

We have now completed the remaining two series of races for this year, the Autumn series held over the last few weeks and the Annual series which has been running since the beginning of the year.

The results have been calculated using competitors best 20 finishes in the case of the Autumn series and the best 45 finishes for the Annual series. I would normally have used higher thresholds to calculate these results and obtain a more meaningful outcome, but due to the late start to the season and other days when racing was not possible due to light winds or bad weather etc, I have settled on 20 and 45 finishes. Unfortunately, some of our sailors have been unable to reach these thresholds and have been excluded from the final tally.
