# RC YACHTING: FEBRUARY 2024

Thankyou to everyone who has continued to sail throughout the winter period, we have had good numbers and some very good close racing.

We have also had a few windless days but I guess we have to take what the weather gives us.

Of note is the launching of two new 60 inch scale J class yachts belonging to Martin Harris and Rick Godley. These two model yachts look lovely on the water and in a bit of breeze scoot along beautifully, they also set up that classic wake pattern astern which only heavy displacement boats can do with a deep quarter wave and a curling bow wave from the long fine entry.

However these boats are quite complex with overlapping genoas and lots of adjustable controls, there may have a few teething troubles and head scratching along the way? but the end result is something to be proud of.

Rick actually has been a busy boy, building a camera ship to video our sailing from offshore and almost at water level. This new vessel is an electric powered launch fitted with a GO PRO camera on the cabin top, it is able to get very close to the action and the results so far very promising.

The new racing season starts on Thursday 29th February for the spring series and Saturday 2nd March sees the beginning of the annual series.
